How to Reach the Fair Haven Inn

From the New York State Thruway: Exit 48 Batavia to Route 98 North, follow it to Route 104. We are at that junction (approx. 25 Minutes).

From Downtown Rochester/Airport Area and Points East: Take Route 490 west to Route 390 north. Exit route 104 West and follow to Route 98. We are at that junction (approx. 45 Minutes).

From Downtown Buffalo/Airport Area and Points West: Take NY State Thruway Exit 48 Batavia to Route 98 north, follow it to Route 104. We are at that junction (approx. 50 Minutes).

From Niagara Falls and Canada: Cross Lewiston Bridge from Canada and follow signs (immediately after customs) to Route 104 East. Follow to Route 98 junction where we are located (approx. 50 minutes).

TILLMAN'S HISTORIC VILLAGE INN



Open year-round, seven days a week for lunch and dinner, the historic Village Inn is a great destination or rest stop "along the way."

Located in the Cobblestone Historic District, the Village Inn opened in 1824 as a way station for the stagecoaches that once rumbled through, and has been open almost continuously since.

The restored interior of the restaurant has a casually elegant feel, still in keeping with the history of the inn. The attached barn that once housed the stagecoach horses has been renovated into the charming Carriage Room complete with the original exposed beams. Historic photos and artifacts can be found throughout the restaurant.

Although most famous for its prime rib, the restaurant serves prime steaks, fresh seafood, and homestyle "comfort food," such as barbequed ribs, hamsteak, pork chops, and real roast turkey with stuffing, just to list a few.
